BUBBLE SNAKES

Have some fun in the sun with this upcycled bubble-snake maker.

MATERIALS

- Plastic water or soda bottle
- Small container
- Piece of fabric; a sock or dishcloth works great
- Rubber band
- Scissors
- Dish soap
- Water



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Clean a plastic water or soda bottle.
2. Carefully cut the bottom off the bottle.
3. Cover cut side of the bottle with your fabric piece and fasten with a rubber band.
4. You can also decorate your bottle with sharpies or tape!
5. Cover the bottom of a small bowl with dish soap. Make sure the container is wide enough to fit the fabric covered side of your bottle.
6. Add a small bit of water to thin the dish soap.
7. Dip the fabric end into the dish soap and blow gently through the bottle.
8. NOTE: This project is better suited for our older Figlets who won't have trouble blowing out the bubbles instead of accidentally sucking them into the bubble tube.
9. Some suggestions for play are:
 - How long can you make a snake without it breaking?
 - How big of a stack of bubbles can you make?
 - Can you make a picture with your bubble snake?
 - See if you can get your snake to catch the wind and float away.
