FIG at Home **LEAF PRINT CARDS**

Make these easy leaf print cards to send to someone you love in this time of physical distancing.

MATERIALS

- Washable paints
- Blank cards or cardstock paper
- Newspaper or tray
- Collected leaves from around your yard or neighborhood
- Paintbrushes



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Take a walk around your yard or neighborhood and collect leaves. Leaves with ridges and texture on the back work best.
- 2. To make a card, cut a piece of printer size card-stock paper in half. It will measure 5.5" x 8.5." Fold this in half. You can also experiment with other sizes. Maybe you want to make a giant card or a teeny tiny one. Whatever size you decide, or if you are using blank pre-made cards, make sure your leaves will fit on the paper before covering them with paint.
- 3. On a tray or piece of extra paper, flip your leaves upside down so the ridges are facing up.
- 4. Paint the bumpy side of the leaf completely.
- 5. Carefully pick up your leaf and press it, paint side down, onto your card.
- 6. Firmly press the leaf onto the paper, pressing from the stem out to the edges of the leaf.
- 7. Lift up your leaf to reveal your leaf print!
- 8. You can print more leaves on the same paper but we suggest letting the first print dry before adding more.
- 9. Let your card(s) dry completely before writing a nice letter.
